We all want to be prepared for weather emergencies in our area and when traveling. Having a hearing loss presents challenges with altering systems during emergencies. Jim will discuss emergency preparedness with practical advice for everyone in your family.

Jim has been with the NWS in various roles since 1978. As the Warning Coordination Meteorologist (WCM), he is the primary liaison between the NWS office and the external emergency managers in the community. In addition to Hazardous Weather Coordination and Spotter Training, the WCM is responsible for the Public Education Program. In this role, Jim is responsible for the hazardous weather education program in our community. He also promotes the science of meteorology and an understanding of weather forecasting to the general public.

Jim's office reached out [to] our chapter to ensure that the NWS is providing services to people who are deaf and hard of hearing. We appreciate the contact and special attention.
